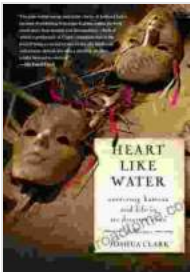


Surviving Katrina and Life in Its Disaster Zone

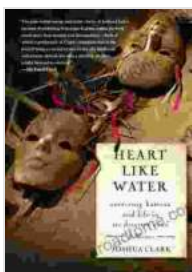
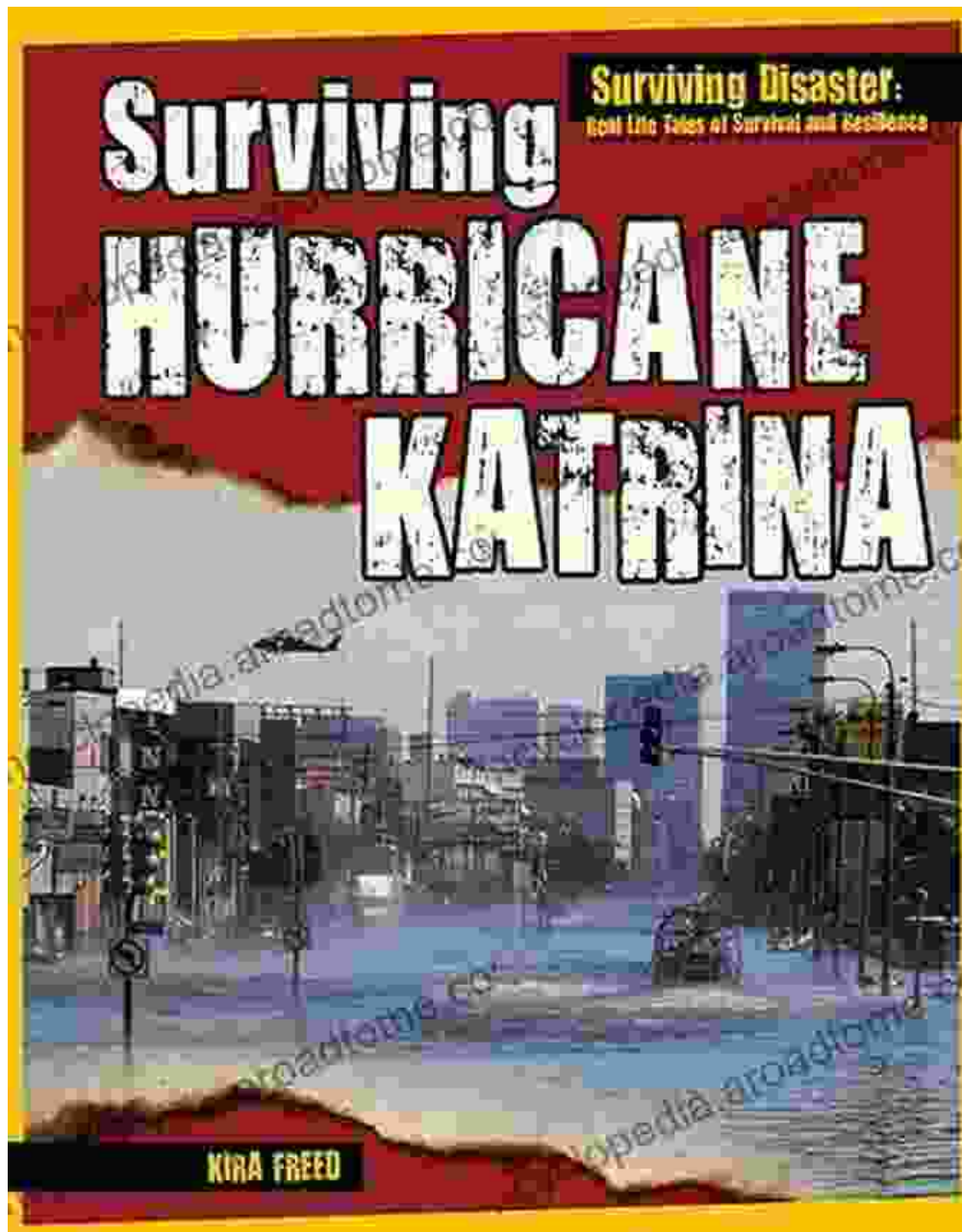
